HIGH HOLIDAYS: Rosh Hashanah (Jewish New Year) begins at sundown, **September 29**, and the following 10 days are a solemn period known as the *Ten Days of Repentance*. Jewish belief refers to the *Book of Life*, in which every person's acts, words, and thoughts are recorded during the year. During Rosh Hashanah, this book is "opened," and all deeds are examined. Each individual's

fate for the coming year is then determined based upon their deeds. The holiest day of the year, Yom Kippur, follows Rosh Hashanah. It begins at sundown, **October 8**, and is known as the Day of Atonement or "Sabbath of Sabbaths." This holiday is devoted to prayer, fasting, and requests for forgiveness of wrongdoing. Jewish tradition tells that judgment of every man, woman, and child is inscribed in the *Book of Life* and sealed on Yom Kippur. The day closes with hope for forgiveness and prayers for health and happiness for the coming year. and help determine the new mayor of Marlborough, the at-large city councilor (our Ward 1 councilor, Joseph Delano, is running unopposed) school and two committee members. New Horizons is proud of its consistently high voter turnout rate of typically more than 80 percent. This significant voting block means that residents' opinions are definitely heard at City Hall. On September 13, the mayoral candidates visited New Horizons

for a forum and on **September 28**, we will host a similar forum for ward councilor candidates. *Residents may register to vote through October 12.* Although the New Horizons bus will run a shuttle to the polls throughout Election Day, many residents may find it more convenient to vote by absentee ballot.
