

Shoe Snippets

Fun facts about the historic Cummings Center site, formerly known as "The Shoe"

In an early employee engagement initiative, United Shoe strove to promote work/life balance by providing staff with access to small luxuries, such as a clubhouse, athletic fields, shooting ranges, and gardening plots.

Three hundred acres was more land than The Shoe needed for its business operations, so it allowed employees to plant gardens in the surrounding farmland free of charge. Workers were permitted to seek assistance from agriculturists in this endeavor, but were responsible for paying for the services provided to ensure that they felt they were paying their own way.
