2022 Grant Cycle Underway: After trickling in for most of the two-month submission window, funding proposals poured in just before the deadline. Local nonprofits filed 580 proposals—including 327 submitted in the final two days alone—for the <u>Cummings \$25 Million Grant</u>



<u>Program</u>. The applicants—which continue to represent a wide variety of causes, including education, food insecurity, elder care, social justice, and healthcare—submitted requests to be considered for 140 grants, totaling \$25 million, to be awarded next June. The Foundation's team of volunteer reviewers is now evaluating the proposals to determine which will be invited to submit full applications. Friendly Reminders

Fall Back: Daylight Saving Time ends at **2:00 AM Sunday, November 7**. Remember to turn the clocks *back* one hour.

Flu Tips: Flu season has begun. With COVID-19 still circulating, it is more important than ever to stay healthy. Here are several actions people can take to lower the risk of spreading influenza and other illnesses in the workplace:

- Get the flu vaccine, especially if you have a condition that makes health complications from the flu more likely.
- Frequently wash hands with soap and water or an alcohol-based hand gel.
- Cough or sneeze into a clean tissue or the inside of your elbow.
- Avoid close contact with others who have a cold or the flu.
- Regularly clean items that are often touched by others, such as door handles, phones, faucets, keyboards, and copiers.

Talking Trash: Clients are reminded to please observe some simple guidelines for trash removal. Thank you, in advance, for your cooperation.

- To prevent unsightly carpet stains and burns, all trash bags and barrels should be carried or carted—not dragged—over carpeted floors.
- Please remember that the trash compactor is for normal office waste only.
- When trash is placed in one of the compactors, the compactor ram *must* be operated to prevent overflows and jams.
- Please do not leave unwanted items, such as furniture or other large items, in or near the compactors, or on any of the loading docks.
- Also remember that all cardboard boxes or materials need to be broken down before being placed into recycling dumpsters or bins. This will help maximize capacity, as well as greatly assist our recycling efforts.
