Friendly Reminders

Most parking spaces immediately adjacent to Cummings Center buildings are designated for short-term use only. These spaces are expected to turn over frequently to provide convenient access to visitors and patrons of the more than 600 on-site businesses. Short-term spaces are identified by signage and are monitored throughout the day. **Reminder/violation stickers will be placed on vehicles parked for extended periods, and repeat violators will be towed at the expense of the vehicle owner.**

Fun facts about the historic Cummings Center site, formerly known as "The Shoe"

The restoration and transformation of the 2 million-square-foot Shoe site was one of the world's largest industrial plant recycling projects. Approximately 32 acres of interior space were completely restored. Some of the original structures are still visible. For example, the 100-E and 100-L glass entrances of 100 Cummings Center were built around the existing concrete structure.
