There is still time to apply forCOVID-19 relief funding through <u>Massachusetts Growth Capital Corporation</u>'s Community Development Block Grant COVID-19 (CDBG-CV) Microenterprise Assistance Grant Program. Qualifying microenterprises that have



been adversely impacted by COVID-19 can apply for up to \$10,000 each in funding **until October 23**. The city of Beverly has established a <u>webpage</u> to provide updates on the program as they become available. All applications must be <u>submitted to the MGCC</u>.
