
Trash and Recycling at 48 and 50 Dunham Ridge

Recyclable materials must be separated from trash prior to disposing of general office trash in the buildings' dumpsters/compactors. Single stream recycling bins are provided for cardboard, paper, plastic, glass, and aluminum containers. For locations, see below.

Item	Disposal Area (see site map below)
Aluminum Cans	Single Stream recycling bins at 48 and 50 Dunham Ridge loading docks
Cardboard	Single Stream recycling bins at 48 & 50 Dunham Ridge loading docks
Glass	Single Stream recycling bins at 48 and 50 Dunham Ridge loading docks
Office Trash	Dumpsters at 50 Dunham Ridge loading dock & Pondside Drive, & compactor at 48 Dunham Ridge loading dock
Paper	Single Stream recycling bins at 48 and 50 Dunham Ridge loading docks
Plastic	Single Stream recycling bins at 48 and 50 Dunham Ridge loading docks



- Recyclable materials must be separated from office trash and placed in designated recycling bins, per Massachusetts law. Disposal of cardboard or other recyclable materials in the trash may result in an improper disposal fee.
- Disposal of wood, metal, furniture, construction material, and electronics is prohibited. Please contact a junk removal company to dispose of such items.
- Remember to run the compactor at 48 Dunham Ridge loading dock after each use. Close the lid on the trash dumpsters to prevent wildlife from accessing the trash.
- Disposal of items from off site (e.g. home renovation projects) is strictly prohibited, and violators will be charged a disposal charge.
- Client firms that receive pallets should hire a junk removal company for their disposal; the pallets should be stored inside the suite.
- 48 and 50 Dunham Ridge client firms are prohibited from using the dumpsters at 42, 43/44, and 51 Dunham Ridge.
