Ferro Papiliones

Most prominent in North America, monarch butterflies are noted for their brilliant orange and black coloring, with some white spots. According to legend, they were originally named in honor of England's King William III, a.k.a. the Prince of Orange, in 1780.


Migrating monarchs were said to have been important symbols of seasonal change to the Hopi and Navajo people, and are meaningful in many modern cultures as far away as south and central Africa.

Our Iron Butterflies were designed by Cummings Properties' chief design officer, Jim Trudeau, a long-time Beverly resident. The nine-foot tall, bright orange sculptures were fully fabricated

in our own workshop and then installed by Cummings Properties' craftspeople from unlikely ¾-inch thick steel plates. Some see a resemblance to public art pieces created by the renowned sculptor Alexander Calder.

The 22 commissioned pieces of this roadside art are being installed at the most significant developments of Cummings Foundation and its affiliated entities in a dozen area communities. Symbols of re-birth and transformation, these Iron Butterflies ("Ferro Papiliones") are offered as Massachusetts communities begin to emerge from the peak of the COVID-19 public health crisis.
